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## competition description

### Manufacture a stained glass window

The competition will be of 2 days duration.

The competition is designed to test the practical competence of learners studying within a programme for Stained Glass.

Entrants will be asked to complete a task which will involve: - The interpretation of a written practical brief; cutting glass to a construction cartoon; leading, soldering and finishing of a stained glass window to industry standards.

The Practical brief and cartoon will be issued to entrants at the beginning of the competition and time will be allowed for candidates to familiarise themselves with the task presented.

### **Judges will award points for:**

A maximum of 100 marks may be achieved. Marks will be deducted for elements which are achieved but out with the stated tolerances.

## judging

A panel of judges have been drawn from industry, colleges and training providers. The judges' decisions will be independently moderated and quality assured before being confirmed.
