Pre-Competition Activity

Competition Task

North Warwickshire and South Leicestershire College will supply all materials on the day of the competition. Each team will be provided with a workstation, internet access, drawing and mark making materials and storyboard templates.

Participants must be in teams of 3.

- participants are able to carry out initial research on the 'Superhero' film genre in advance of the competition. They are encouraged to bring the research materials with them for the competition.
- you will work in teams of 3 to produce a storyboard for a short Superhero film sequence based on images provided for you at the competition. You will need to select appropriate annotation (which should include camera movement, edit transitions, effects and sound for this on the day).
- final story boards must be formally presented at the end of the competition. Presentations should last 2-4 minutes and each team member must participate.

You will be given 45 minutes to produce your storyboard and 30 minutes to plan and practice your presentation.

Marking and Assessment

Judges will be marking against the criteria:

- research
- planning for main task and the presentation
- idea Development
- coherent Storyboards that reflect storytelling and continuity of action
- quality and coherency of the annotations
- presentation skills
- time management
- team working

Additional information

- competitors will receive a Health & Safety briefing at the start of the competition.
- competitors will start, and finish work as instructed by the judges.
- competitors who arrive late for the event will not receive additional time
- if there is a power stoppage, breakdown of equipment or accident, the competitors must act according to the instruction of the organiser
- no mobile telephones are allowed in the competition room
- if during the competition a competitor feels they must leave their work area (e.g. medical reasons, toilet break), they will have the time recorded on a 'time out' sheet by a member of staff
- the judge's decision is final
