1. Learning about careers and the world of work

Learning Outcomes

1. Students will learn about their working rights
2. Students will understand what an apprenticeship is and the levels available

SLIDE NUMBER	TIMINGS	KEY TEACHING POINTS
1-3	1 minute	Introduction slide.
4-8	4 minutes	Read through the slides.
9-10	2 minutes	Watch the two videos on two apprentices.
11	6 minutes	Give students time to review the Your Rights sheet. Do they have any examples to share?
11	2 minutes	Share the 'Minimum Wage' slide. Do students think the payments are fair? Have they had experiences of not being paid the right amount?
12-13	2 minutes	Read through the slides.
14	3.5 minutes	Watch Apprentice Ethan's CNC Milling story.
15-16	2 minutes	Wash-up – ask students to complete the reflection sheet.

Evaluation & Reflection

Check the reflection sheet. Have students identified things they wish to work on? Did all students find the session useful?
