# **Learning Outcomes**

- · Students will learn what a CV is
- · Students will learn how to create their own CV
- Students will learn about online job applications and sending a CV on spec



SLIDE NUMBER	TIMINGS	KEY TEACHING POINTS
2	1 minute	Introduction slide.
3	2 minutes	Do students know what a CV is? Does anyone have one?
3	3 minutes	Cover the key elements of a CV.
4	5 minutes	Get students to compare the two CVs – they could have a red pen to highlight any errors.
5-6	5 minutes	Discuss the two CVs – do they think that getting it wrong makes a difference?
7	1 minute	Talk about online applications.
9	2 minutes	Wash-up – ask students to complete the reflection sheet.

**Preparation:** Make sure that you have printed all of the resources.

**Differentiation/Meeting Individual Need:** Provide any support to students that may struggle to see the differences in the two CVs.

**Extension Work:** Students could be tasked with creating their first CV and bringing it back to the class to be checked by you and other classmates.
