Lesson Plan - 20 minutes (Assembly & Lesson)

1. Developing your career management, employability and enterprise skills

Learning Outcomes

- Students will look forward over the next five to ten years and identify key activities in their 'countdown to employment'
- Students will think about how to build the skills and experience needed for successful employment/self-employment
- Students will recognise the importance of taking control of their futures
- Students will identify options that interest and motivate them to do their best

Resources Needed

SLIDE NUMBER	TIMINGS	KEY TEACHING POINTS
1-3	1 minute	Introduction slide.
4	2 minutes	Get students thinking about their vision for their future.
5	1 minute	Share that students can be taking steps now to achieve the future of their dreams.
5	5 minutes	Get students to circle the things they could be doing now on the Countdown sheet to achieve the future of their dreams.
6	9 minutes	Get students to complete the Action Plan sheet.
6	2 minutes	Wash-up – ask students to complete the reflection sheet.

Differentiation/Meeting Individual Need: You may need to support some students to think about the future they want to have, or how they can overcome certain barriers.
