# **Learning Outcomes**

- Students will understand what Skills Competitions are and why they can be so important
- Students will understand what being a Young Professional means and why it is important
- Students will understand how to develop their skills for life and work

### **Frameworks**

SLIDE NUMBER	TIMINGS	KEY TEACHING POINTS
1	1 minute	Explain that in this session students will learn how they can start to be the very best version of them- selves ready for their future careers.
2	1 minute	WorldSkills UK - who we are.
3	2 minutes	Discuss the slide, have students ever considered that they can actually train to become leaders, experts in their chosen career?
4	3 minutes	Play the video.
5	4 minutes	Explain that through WorldSkills UK young people compete against each other in different fields to be the very best across the UK. Play the video.
6	1 minute	Not all young people would want to compete or can. But all young people can invest in themselves so they can get ahead of the competition for jobs.
7-8	1 minute	Talk through the slide so students understand they can join the Young Professional Programme on their own. Also discuss if students will be given time to do this in school.
9	1 minute	Remind students that no one can really do this for them it's down to them, which is what makes it so exciting!
10	2 minutes	Wash-up – ask students to complete the reflection sheet.
